## Boy Scout Troop 223

### Three Step Disciplinary Process

(regarding meetings, campouts, or any other Scout event)

#### Step One - WARNING

- If a scout is refusing to participate, misbehaves, causing unruliness or if the Scout is engaged in an unsafe activity or behavior unbecoming of a Scout he will be given a warning. Upon return from the activity, his parents or guardian will be informed of the ordeal. Other adult leaders will be informed who are present.

#### Step Two-CALL PARENTS OR GUARDIAN

- For the second occurrence, the scout will be required to call his parents from the activity. He will need to explain his actions.

#### Step Three-PICKED UP FROM ACTIVITY

- If a third occurrence arises, the scout will call his parents or guardian to pick him up from the activity. Future participation in activities will be determined by the scoutmaster with input by troop committee.
- If fees were collected, no refunds will be given.
- Advancement may be delayed due to lack of Scout Spirit.

#### Campout Responsibilities

On each campout there are a number of responsibilities that need to be completed of which the majority of them fall upon the Scout. The purpose of the campouts is not only to introduce the Scout to the outdoors, but to provide a venue where the Scout can learn responsibility and teamwork through success and failure. Below is a general list of the responsibilities of the boy scouts which can and will be adjusted by the camp tour leader.

**Scout responsibilities** –Purchase all food, load and unload trailer at the church and campsite. To setup the camp which includes setting up all tents, ax yard, and cooking areas. To cook and clean-up all meals. To take part in all activities and to obey the Outdoor code.

**Adult responsibilities** – it is the responsibility of the adult to NOT do any task that the Scout can do for himself, but may offer guidance or direction when necessary. Scouting Campouts are NOT mini vacations for adults. While adult responsibilities are limited, it is expected that all adults follow the same rules as the scouts like NO ELECTRONICS and obeying the outdoor code. It is the responsibility of the adults to monitor the scouts and to maintain a safe environment. Adults are also expected to assist the camp tour leader with task like supervision of hikes or other activities and to assist in the Scout's advancements.

**Adults are expected to take the Youth Protection Training offered by the BSA to continue to attend**
